INTRODUCING THE TOWN OF FAIRFIELD SHORE BICYCLE ROUTE

The Shore Bicycle Route is one of the most popular areas for biking, running, and walking in Fairfield. This route provides access to the Town's business districts and is steps away from major retail areas along the Post Road in Fairfield's historic downtown, as well as charming Southport Center.

Included along the route are the scenic Fairfield beaches Jennings, Penfield, and Southport, as well as many of the cultural and historically significant areas of Town. You can experience the historic Town Green where the Fairfield Town Hall, History Museum, Independence Hall, Burr Mansion and Sun Tavern are located, along with other monuments and historic structures. On the route you can stop in to the main Fairfield Public Library and the Pequot Library in Southport. Visit the beautiful open spaces at Ash Creek, One Rod Highway Marsh and Oldfield Marsh, or take in the scenery at the South Benson Marina and Southport Harbor.

This route connects up to neighboring municipalities Bridgeport and Westport at popular areas including nearby Saint Mary's By The Sea in Black Rock and the vistas along Beachside Avenue in Westport. Enjoy your travels!



NEWS AND NOTES

In addition to the Shore Route, other official Town of Fairfield Bicycle Routes are the Mill Plain Road Route, which runs from the intersection of Brookside Drive south on Mill Plain Road into Fairfield center, and the Library to Library Route, which connects the Fairfield Woods Library Branch with the main Fairfield Public Library in Fairfield center.

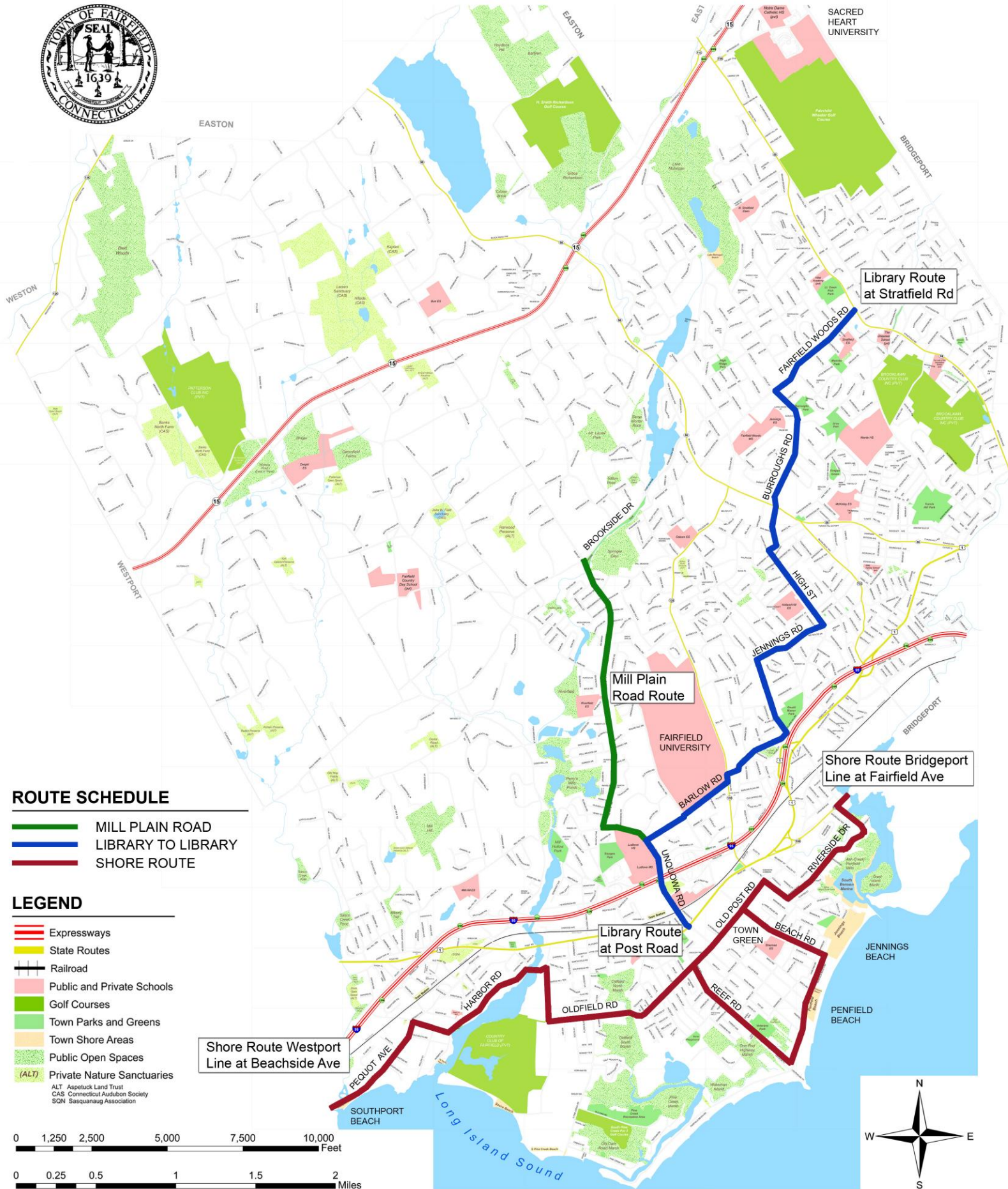
The Fairfield BikeShare at Zane's Cycles (1215 Post Rd) is now operating. Initiated by the Fairfield Health Department and Fairfield Public Libraries, and sponsored by Fairfield University and Sacred Heart University, Fairfield BikeShare consists of 10 3-speed, custom designed bikes. Residents and visitors can borrow a bike and take a bike ride for FREE!

The Town of Fairfield Bicycle and Pedestrian Committee is a nine member volunteer committee appointed by the First Selectman to encourage walking and biking for transportation, recreation, exercise, and quality of life. Walking and biking conserve energy, improve air quality, reduce traffic and the need for parking, improve health and fitness, and invigorate the local economy through increased access to local businesses and greater potential for tourism.
